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## **STOVES HISTORY**


Founded on Valentine's Day 1920, Stoves begins a reputation for manufacturing excellence.



Culinary evidence suggests our modern grilled cheese (consisting of processed cheese and sliced white bread) began in the 1920s.

Typical meals included steak and kidney pie, suet pudding with potatoes, peas or cabbage and baked ham with eggs.







XAVIER MAREL BOULESTIN
publishes Simple French
Cooking for the English Home
in 1923 – even reportedly
teaching Winston Churchill
recipes from the book.
His Restaurant Boulestin is
said to have been the most
expensive restaurant in London
in the 1920s.



## **HISTORIC EVENTS**

Agatha Christie's first novel – The Mysterious Affair at Styles – is published in the UK on 21st January 1921, introducing Hercule Poirot. The first featurelength 'talkie' film, The Jazz Singer, premiers at the Piccadilly Theatre on 27th September 1928.
